Welcome to this Kowhai Singers Concert where we will sing for you (with the help of a few friends) Maria Theresa Mass by Joseph Haydn. This piece was composed by Haydn in 1799, between the Creation and the Seasons. The first performance took place on the name-day of the princess Maria Josepha Hermangild, wife of Haydn's employer prince Nikolas Esterhazy, for whom he had already written four masses for similar occasions. It was performed in the court chapel in Vienna as early as May 1800. In May, 2024, 224 years later, we hope you enjoy our performance.



Ken Leech: Musical Director

John Wells is a classical organist, pianist, teacher, composer and recording artist. He made NZ's first organ CD and is the only recitalist ever to give an organ concert in a shearing shed. As Auckland City Organist from 1998 to

2012, he spearheaded the project to build a new organ in the Town Hall; \$4 million and 40 tonnes later, it now ranks among the world's notable Town

Hall instruments. He enjoys Warkworth's lively music scene and accompa-

runner-up in the Hamilton Vocal Competition in 2023 and has been a finalist in the New Zealand Aria. Wellington Aria and North Shore Aria Competitions. Jordan is an alumnus of the prestigious New Zealand Opera School (2021, 2022, 2023) and in 2023, he was the recipient of the Dame Sister Mary Foundation scholarship.

Miles Timmis: Bass

Miles is a baritone and conductor from Tāmaki Makaurau's North Shore. He has performed as a soloist in Auckland and around NZ, and last year completed his Honours degree in Classical Voice Performance at the University of Auckland, graduating with First Class Honours. In 2023 he was a finalist in the Ronald Dellow Memorial Vocal Recital Competition and won the Graham Allen Prize in Musical Theatre. He has performed with all three of NZ's national choirs, been a conducting scholar with Harbour Voices, Auckland Youth Choir, and the NZ Choral Federation, and is a member of the NZ Opera Chorus. He is currently preparing to move to London in August this year, where he will be studying a Masters in Musical Theatre Performance at the Guildford School of Acting.

INTERVAL

Maria Theresa Mass

The Mass unfolds in six movements, each meticulously crafted to showcase Haydn's mastery of form and expression. It is unusual in that almost all of the solo work is in the form of ensemble singing, often with interjections by the choir to echo or emphasise significant texts.

The Kyrie begins with a plea for mercy, its plaintive melodies gradually building to a fervent climax. The Gloria bursts forth with jubilant exultation, its triumphant "brass" fanfares (beautifully reproduced by John Wells on the organ) and cascading choral passages proclaiming the glory of God.

In the Credo, Haydn crafts a narrative of belief, weaving intricate counterpoint and stirring harmonies to affirm the central tenets of Christian faith. The Sanctus transports listeners to heavenly realms, its ethereal choral textures and angelic melodies evoking a sense of divine transcendence.

The Benedictus offers a moment of serene reflection, its gentle melodies and pastoral instrumentation inviting contemplation and prayer. Finally, the Agnus Dei brings the Mass to a close with a plea for peace, its plaintive strains offering solace and hope in the midst of uncertainty.

Throughout the Maria Theresa Mass, Haydn demonstrates a remarkable ability to blend elements of both the Classical style and the profound emotional depth of the Baroque era. His innovative use of orchestral colour, rich harmonic language, and expressive vocal writing creates a work of enduring beauty and spiritual power.

As we come together to experience this timeless masterpiece, let us be reminded of the enduring power of music to uplift the human spirit and unite us in shared moments of transcendence.
